Ana María Aramayo - In Memoriam

It is with great sadness that we report the death of Ana María Aramayo, former Assistant Director ELT at British Council Mexico. Ana María managed many ELT projects during her 22-year career with the Council, including the national SEP project in the early 90's to promote the teaching and learning of English in every state university in the country through COTE courses (COTE has become ICELT – In-Service Certificate in English Language Teaching). SEP officially recognised COTE in 2001, the first non-Mexican teaching qualification to be so recognised. Ana María was honoured by the Queen with an MBE (Member of the Order of the British Empire) for all her work in ELT over so many years in Mexico. She will be greatly missed by all the many contacts and friends who remember her for her kindness and professionalism.



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
