Not many people know what ALTE and the "Can Do" statements are, however, they are a major feature of our exams.

Cambridge ESOL is a member of ALTE – the Association of Language Testers in Europe, which provides a forum for the development of assessment standards for European languages.

Our exams are backed up by the "Can Do" statements, developed by members of ALTE. The "Can Do" system provides a description of what typical candidates at each level can be expected to do in each of the language skills and in a range of contexts.
